Marilynne Robinson is widely considered one of the greatest American writers of our time. Her novels have been universally acclaimed, with *Gilead* (2004) receiving the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction. As an essayist, novelist, and moral thinker, Robinson writes with precision and beauty about difficult topics of race, family, and religion that underlie society.

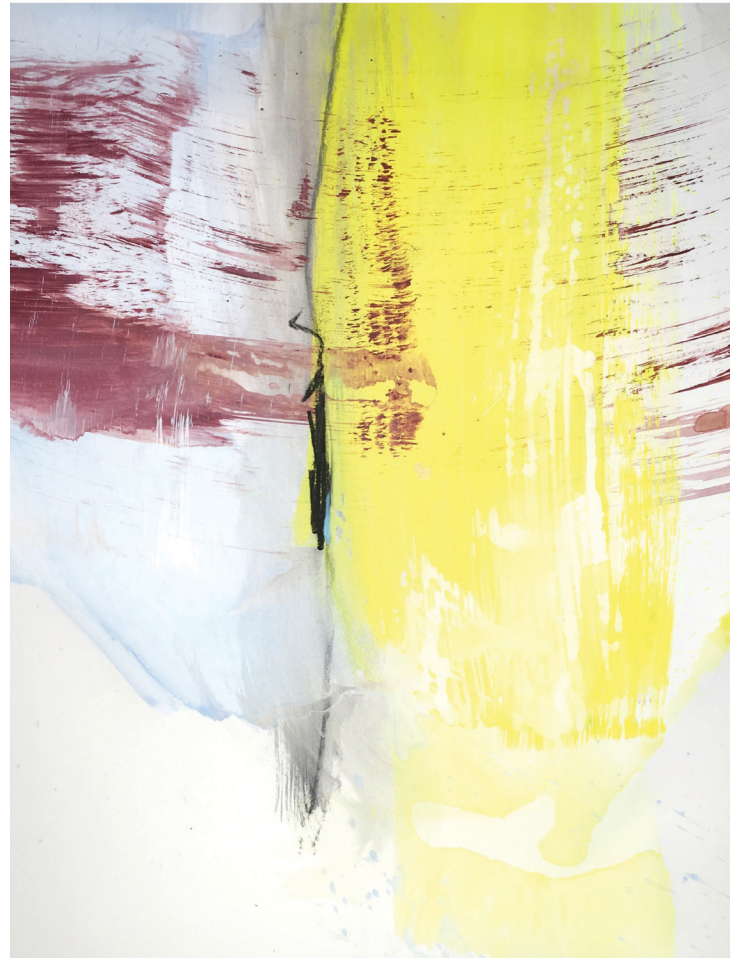
Robinson grew up in Sandpoint, Idaho, and studied American literature at Brown University, graduating in 1966. She returned to the Northwest and in 1977 completed a doctorate on Shakespeare at University of Washington. Eventually, she joined the University of Iowa in 1989. Today, Marilynne Robinson is professor emeritus at The University of Iowa Writer's Workshop and lives in Iowa City, where on occasion she preaches for the Congregational United Church of Christ.

Today, Robinson will take part in a question-and-answer dialogue at 10:30am in the Sanctuary and then will read again from her writings at 5:30pm, also in the Sanctuary.

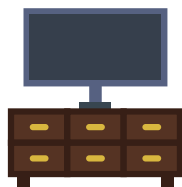
